arol Carlan is a pillar of light and hope in our Pensacola community, and someone we are deeply proud to call an alumnus of Pensacola State College. Carol is a prominent community leader and accomplished business executive with over 35 years of experience in banking, including being the first female president of a large regional bank. Following her banking career, she served as President of the Ascension Sacred Heart Foundation, leading a major capital campaign resulting in a new children's hospital and expanded services. Appointed by Gov. Jeb Bush in 2004, she served as the inaugural chair and was a board member for the Institute For Human & Machine Cognition (IHMC) for 18 years. She now proudly serves as the Director of Philanthropy at IHMC.

As CEO of Carlan Consulting, she's a key figure in leadership development, founding member of the John Maxwell Team, and delivers leadership training to businesses globally. Beyond her professional roles, Carol's deep commitment to community service is evident through her involvement in over 35 nonprofit organizations, earning her numerous awards for her impactful contributions.

We were honored to sit with Carol and learn her rich history, inclusive of her time at our college.

Carol's formative years were marked by profound responsibility and unwavering determination, being entrusted with the care of her siblings when her mother left at a very young age — then in a whirlwind of change, Carol was placed in the care of foster homes through a church ministry. She notes that being raised in six different homes exposed her to the rich tapestry of humanity, fostering a deep-seated empathy and understanding. Despite the weight of her circumstances, she emerged as a nurturer and leader, embodying both strength and compassion.

It's this mindset of embracing challenges and transforming them into opportunities that defines Carol's approach to empowerment. Carol would go on to find work at a local bookstore in Fort Walton Beach, where her mindset, already optimistic, would deepen with the chance to read books like "Think and Grow Rich" on her lunch break. She would also find musical talent and leadership in the band, her band instructor developing her soon to be blooming leadership skills, and leading her to Pensacola State College.

Amidst her pursuit of education, tragedy struck as her father passed away. Yet, even in the face of personal loss, Carol found solace and support in the caring community of faculty and staff at the college. They rallied around her, offering not only condolences but practical assistance, rearranging her schedule and providing the necessary support to ensure she could graduate on time.

This demonstration of empathy and solidarity left a lasting impression on Carol, reinforcing her belief in the power of community and the importance of lifting each other up in times of need. It was through the unwavering support of her college community that Carol was able to navigate through adversity and emerge stronger than ever.

Carol's commitment to her alma mater extends beyond her college years. As the longest-serving esteemed member of the Pensacola State College Board of Trustees and Emeritus and member of the Pensacola State Foundation, she continues to champion education and mentorship, recognizing their profound impact on shaping future generations.

For Carol, empowerment is a multifaceted journey encapsulated by the mantra of "know, grow, sow." It's about knowing oneself, nurturing personal growth, and sowing seeds of positivity and change in the community. To commemorate her life, Pensacola State College established the Carla Williams Memorial Endowed Scholarship, ensuring her spirit of



generosity and support lives on. Her remarkable contributions were further recognized at the state level when she was inducted into the 2024 FCSAA Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, solidifying her place among Florida basketball's best.

since the inaugural class walked the halls of the downtown Pensacola boarding house in 1948, the success of our students has been at the forefront of Pensacola State College's mission. As we close this historic 75th year, we celebrate the more than 124,600 students who have graduated from PSC, earning

associate degrees, bachelor's degrees, and workforce certifications. The alumni of Pensacola State have made lasting contributions both near and far. In this edition of the Anchor, we highlight local community leaders who began their educational journeys at PSC.

Recently, PSC held its largest-ever signing day for student-athletes committing to four-year institutions, with 24 demonstrating the college's slogan "Go Here. Get There." Among them are five members of this year's NJCAA Division II Women's Volleyball National Tournament fourth-place team — a first in the program's history. More athletes have since committed.

Soon, the PSC Alumni Association will host the Distinguished Alumni Awards to honor five individuals and our first-ever couple for their success, unwavering determination, acts of service, and commitment to their communities. As we celebrate everything they stand for and the trails they continue to blaze, we recognize that they represent the undeniable force that PSC has been and will continue to be in our community and beyond.

With many thanks to alumni, Sen. Doug Broxson, Rep. Michelle Salzman, as well as Rep. Alex Andrade, PSC is positioned with legislative funding to build on the Pensacola Campus a new Soccer Field Complex, a Training and Conference Center, an Aviation Airframe and Mechanic Facility at the Pensacola International Airport, and a Diesel Mechanics Facility at the Truck Driving Training Facility in Santa Rosa County. These new facilities will help PSC continue to graduate students for university transfer and our bachelor degree programs, as well as trained skilled craftsmen for high-wage careers in technical fields.
